

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Why Myanmar?

Myanmar, formerly known as Burma has about 10 trillion cubic feet (283.2 bcm) of gas reserves and 50 million barrels reserves of oil, reported by the EIA. According to the Myanmar Oil and Gas Enterprise (MOGE), the total gas production during 2017 fiscal year anticipated to reach 689.8 billion cubic feet, including 14.2 billion cubic feet from onshore blocks and 675.6 billion cubic feet from offshore blocks. The Yadana, Yetagon, Zawtika and Shwe gas projects are expected to collectively produce 515 billion cubic feet of natural gas for export and 160.6 billion cubic feet for local use in the 2016-2017 fiscal year, in line with the second five-year National Development Plan (from 2016-2017 to 2020-2021).

Meanwhile, the government will invite foreign investors to carry out oil exploration and production to meet local energy demand. The government has projected to obtain around US\$6 billion of foreign direct investment, of which the primary investment goes to the oil and gas sector with 32 percent. Recently, the

government has approved Total E&P Myanmar and PTTEP acquisition of a 50 percent stake each in the MD-7 project. PTTEP through PTTEP South Asia Ltd will remain the key operator of the field. Exploration is underway and the operator anticipates to discover more gas reserves at a depth of 80 metres. In addition, under the second five-year National Development Plan, oil and gas laws and bylaws will be amended and drafted to satisfy energy demands for the country's economic development.

According to EICDataStream, across the upstream, midstream and downstream sectors, there are over 15 projects proposed or under development in the country. The upstream sector dominates with a total of 9 projects proposed or under development, worth a staggering estimated spend of US\$2.4 billion.



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Draft itinerary



The visit programme

Local briefings

Once in Yangon, there will be a country briefing to update participants on the economic and political situation and local trading conditions and requirements.

Meetings

Group meetings will be organised by EIC Asia Pacific office, alongside DIT in Myanmar. These will include key players within the industry including representatives from both national and international operators as well as international EPC contractors active in the market. The final programme will be tailored to suit delegates' requirements as closely as possible.

Once your booking is confirmed you will be asked to complete a **Supplementary Data Form** with the names of companies and individuals you would like to see included in the programme. It is the intention to organise structured group visits but with time free for delegates to make individual visits and follow-up calls.

Additional application notes

Participating companies should ensure that the representative on the visit has authority and is competent to discuss the supply of the products or services they wish to sell. In addition they need to be able to meet all the costs of their participation.

Delegate numbers

Total numbers are limited to 16 delegates to ensure group members receive the best value as possible during the visit, however please note we will require a minimum of 10 delegates in order for this visit to go head. Please wait until we confirm the delegation will go ahead and the EIC sends you travel information before booking non-refundable flights.



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Finance

Management fee

To cover the costs incurred by the EIC in organising this delegation, a non-refundable Management Fee is being levied for the participant from each company as follows:

Member of EIC £500 (excl. VAT) one person per company

Non-member £650 (excl. VAT) one person per company

Communal charge

The Communal Charge is the shared cost for production of the delegation brochure, translations, local ground transport (except airport transfers), meeting room hire, delegation manager, programme facilitation plus any other expenses incurred on behalf of the group.

The communal charge is £1,400 (excl. VAT) per delegate.

Please note that the EIC has to settle invoices prior to the visit and pay "on-site" bills. To minimise the EIC's exposure, therefore, we must ask for the communal charge to be paid at the time of booking.

Cancellation charges


In the event of cancellation of the delegation for reasons beyond the control of the EIC, all communal costs committed to the date of cancellation will be charged to the companies who would have participated. In the event of cancellation by an individual company, the company's proportion of the communal costs incurred up to the date of cancellation will be charged. The management fee is payable forthwith in any event.

Hotels

Visas

Flights

You can currently book a return trip from London to Yangon (via Dubai) with Emirates for around £550 (economy) inc Taxes.

The internal return flight to Nay Pyi Taw is not included. The cost for this is around £200 return (economy) inc Taxes.

Please do not book any non-refundable flights until the Delegation has been confirmed.

Vaccinations



Do not book any non-refundable flights before you receive this confirmation. The EIC will give you further details on flights along with booking information for hotels once we can confirm the delegation is going ahead.



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FAOs

I would to like make my own travel arrangements and fly out independently from the group.

This is your decision as delegates come from different cities however we would prefer it if you stayed in the same hotel as the group for logistical reasons. If not, it will be your responsibility to find out about any changes to the itinerary during the visit. If you do make your own flight and accommodation arrangements, please ensure you notify EIC with your details.

This will only be allowed if the visit is under-subscribed, space is limited to one person per company. However should you wish for more than one delegate to attend please let us know and if there is space available on the closing date for applications we will accommodate your request.
